KEY HIGHLIGHTS

IMPORTANT NOTE REGARDING THE FRONTIER COUNTS DATA:

Land port data: There have been significant changes in how country of residence data is collected and established for non-US visitors entering Canada by land ports, starting in August 2018. Statistics Canada advises caution in using this data for comparison with previous months or years, as shifts in land ports arrivals may have impacted total arrivals for some markets.

Starting with January 2019 data, Statistics Canada updated the method of determining trip durations for US residents travelling to Canada and Canadian residents returning from the United States for non-automobile modes of transportation. This change affects the relative proportions of same-day/overnight travellers. Caution is therefore advised when comparing 2019 data with earlier time periods for these modes of transportation.

- With new peak monthly arrivals from China, France, Mexico, and Australia, 2019 started out the gate with a record high of almost 920,000 in January 2019, up 3.8% over the previous peak established in January 2018.
- In January 2019, arrivals from the nine Destination Canada long-haul markets (+8.4%) expanded 5 times faster than the US (+1.6%). Direct air arrivals accounted for 73.0% of arrivals from these markets.
- In advance of Chinese New Year celebrations for the Year of the Pig starting on February 5, 2019 (11 days earlier than in 2018), January arrivals from China jumped to a record high of 54,000 visitors in January 2019, up 31.6% year-over-year. Supported by an 80% increase in seats available on non-stop air service between China and Canada since 2015, January arrivals from China more than doubled over the last five years.
- Arrivals from India (+1.1%) were up in January 2018, despite a contraction in direct air arrivals (-6.3%) for a second consecutive month. While total arrivals from Japan (-20.2%) and South Korea (-13.3%) declined in January 2019, direct air arrivals from South Korea (+5.2%) expanded for the first time in months. Arrivals from Australia (+1.5%) increased for a fourth consecutive month to overtake the UK as Destination Canada's second largest long-haul market in January 2019.
- Adopting a wait-and-see holding pattern amid the Brexit-induced political turbulence, the UK consumer confidence index sank to a five-year low in January 2019. Faced with an uncertain economic outlook, arrivals from the UK (-4.5%) retreated in January 2019. Arrivals from Germany (-4.0%) also contracted in January 2019, as consumer confidence was dampened by the smoldering trade conflict between the US, China and the EU, this in spite of rising income expectations. Bucking the trend, arrivals from France (+10.8%) set a new record.
- Arrivals from Mexico soared by 29.6% in January 2019 to reach a record high of over 27,000 visitors, on par with January arrivals from the UK, France and Australia.





UNITED STATES

- Canada welcomed 580,000 visitors from the US in January 2019, up 1.6% over the same month last year. This was the highest level of January arrivals since 2005.
- This growth was driven primarily by the 310,000 US auto arrivals in January 2019, up 6.2% year-over-year, which accounted for 53.4% of US arrivals this month. This growth was particularly evident in the increased arrivals over the Martin Luther King Jr. Day long weekend compared to the same federal holiday weekend last year (based on IPIL daily arrivals estimates).
- In January 2019, the largest proportions of US auto arrivals (based on IPIL arrival estimates) came from Washington (25.2%), New York (18.9%) and Michigan (12.7%). Washington also saw a notable increase in traffic to Canada compared to January 2018 (+16.4%).
- At the same time, US air arrivals (+1.7%) also increased year-over-year in January 2019, for the first time in 10 months. This positive shift was supported by expanded air capacity between Canada and the US (+8.1%).
- The January growth in US arrivals was only slowed by arrivals by other modes of transport such as bus, train, and cruise (-38.8%). However, Statistics Canada advises caution when comparing 2019 data with earlier time periods for US arrivals via non-automobile modes of transportation due to methodology changes beginning in January 2019.
- Supporting the overall growth in US arrivals to Canada, the purchasing power of the USD in Canada gained strength in January 2019 (+7.0%), maintaining gains acquired at the end of 2018.
- The consumer confidence index published by the US Conference Board fell again to 121.1 in January 2019, the third consecutive month of decline.



- Mexico kicked off 2019 with a record 27,000 visitors in January 2019, up an exceptional 29.6% over January 2018. This marks seven consecutive months of record arrivals from Mexico.
- Now just over two years since the replacement of the visa requirement for Mexican citizens with the eTA in December 2016, the number of January 2019 arrivals more than doubled the number of January 2016 arrivals, prior to that change. At the current level, January arrivals from Mexico are on par with January arrivals from the UK, France and Australia.
- Direct air arrivals from Mexico increased by 20.3%, supported by continued expansion of direct air capacity to Canada from Mexico City (+9.0%).
- The strength of the Mexican Peso in Canada was up in January 2019 compared to the same month a year ago (+5.6%), which is a positive indicator for this market at the start of the year.

Mexico Arrivals by Port of Entry

- The positive performance from Mexico in January 2019 was observed across all modes of entry as arrivals increased by land from the US as well as by air, both direct from overseas and via the US.
- In January 2019, 90.3% of visitors from Mexico flew into Canada, including 73.3% of total visitors who flew directly from Mexico or other overseas origins, and 17.0% who flew via the US. The main of ports of entry by air were YYZ (39.9%), YVR (36.1%) and YUL (17.7%), with an additional 1.9% flying into YYC and 4.4% flying into other Canadian airports.



Trend Plot: Total DC Europe Arrivals



- In January 2019, arrivals from Destination Canada's Europe region reached just over 65,000, up 1.3% over January 2018 and the highest level for the region since 2008.
- This region's overall positive performance was solely driven by record January arrivals from France (26,000 visitors, +10.8%), which managed to outweigh moderate declines from both the UK (27,000 visitors, -4.5%) and Germany (12,000 visitors, -4.0%).
- With this strong growth from France and continuing declines from the UK, January arrivals from France were almost on par with January arrivals from the UK for the first time. At the same time, the UK dropped to become Destination Canada's third largest long-haul market in January 2019, after China and Australia.
- Continuing the trend observed at the end of 2018, arrivals from Germany declined for a fourth consecutive month in January 2019 to the lowest level recorded since January 2015. The decline was recorded across all modes of entry, but particularly via the US.
- Expanded air capacity between France and Canada (+7.7%) supported increased direct air arrivals (+32.7%), while fewer seat availability from the UK (-6.4%) aligned with fewer direct air arrivals (-7.3%). However, direct air arrivals from Germany (-1.5%) fell despite additional seats (+11.9%).
- The purchasing power of the Euro (+0.1%) and British pound (-0.2%) relative to the Canadian dollar remained on par with last year.

DC Europe Arrivals by Port of Entry

- Following a pattern that shaped 2018, arrivals growth from Destination Canada's Europe region were largely curtailed by continuing declines in air arrivals via the US (-29.4%), with all three key markets in the region registering declines, while direct air arrivals (+7.1%) and land arrivals via the US (+44.2%) increased.



ASIA-PACIFIC

- Arrivals from Destination Canada's Asia-Pacific region reached a new monthly record of 118,000 in January 2019, up 8.6% year-over-year. This marked a positive turn for the region, following a downward trend over the past seven months.
- This positive performance was mainly driven by exceptional growth from China (54,000 visitors, +31.6%), which made up close to half of the arrivals from these markets (46%). An earlier start to Chinese New Year celebrations likely supported this trend.
- The region also benefitted from moderate growth from Australia (28,000 visitors, +1.5%), which was Destination Canada's second largest long-haul market in January, and from India (13,000 visitors, +1.1%). Following a spectacular increase in air arrivals direct from overseas last year, air arrivals from India contracted in January 2019 (-6.3%), while air arrivals via the US continued to expand (+11.1%).
- The growth from Australia, China and India outpaced steep declines from Destination Canada's two other Asia-Pacific markets of Japan and South Korea. While total arrivals from Japan (-20.2%) and South Korea (-13.3%) continued the recent downward trend in January 2019, direct air arrivals from South Korea (+5.2%) expanded for the first time in months.
- It should be noted that air arrivals from South Korea yielded robust gains direct from overseas (+5.2%) and via the US (+10.1%). The decline in arrivals from this market was entirely attributed to arrivals by land via the US falling to over half of the number of visitors reported over the same period in 2018.
- In January 2019, non-stop air capacity between Destination Canada's five Asia-Pacific markets and Canada increased by an average of 3.1%. Declining air capacity from Australia (-3.3%) and South Korea

(-3.5%) were more than offset by increased air capacity from China (+5.4%), India (+3.7%) and Japan (+4.6%).

DC Asia-Pacific Arrivals by Port of Entry

- In January 2019, direct arrivals from Destination Canada's Asia-Pacific markets jumped +9.9%, air arrivals via the US edged up 1.1% and overnight land arrivals increased by 14.0%.
- It is important to note that Statistics Canada advises caution in interpreting land port arrival levels, as these figures may have been impacted by changes in data collection processes initiated in August 2018

- Canadians took 2.8 million international trips in January 2019, down 2.5% compared to the same month a year ago. This decline was primarily due to fewer Canadians visiting the US (1.5 million trips, -7.6%), outpacing an increase in the number of trips to other international destinations (1.3 million trips, +3.8%).
- The decline in Canadian travel to the US in January 2019 was seen across all modes of transportation. The number of Canadians returning to the US by automobile in January 2019 declined by 5.2% compared to January 2018. This was followed by a decline of 8.7% in Canadians returning from the US by plane, with the biggest decrease in travel to the US by other modes of transportation, such as bus, train, or cruise (-22.4%).

- Consistent with historical trends, most international visitors to Canada in January 2019 crossed the border in Ontario (43.8%), British Columbia (32.8%), and Quebec (15.9%).
- With total international arrivals up by 3.8% year-over-year in January 2019, the biggest increases came through British Columbia (+9.6%, 26,000 additional arrivals) and Quebec (+9.6%, 13,000 additional arrivals). The biggest decrease was seen in Ontario (-2.8%, 12,000 fewer arrivals).
